- 1. <u>Adobe Stock alpine mountain photo</u> (licensed)
 - <u>Watermarked version available</u>





Exercise 1

Create a customized style kit to enable consistent Firefly output for your brand

1. Open the Firefly website **Text to Image** feature.





- 2. In the prompt field, use the following prompt for this exercise: "A candid photo, side view of a woman and her dog, sitting on a mountain top, enjoying amazing mountain view."
- 3. Click the **Generate** button to get the initial set of Firefly variants.





- 4. Review the available settings within the left-hand column:
 - a. Change **Aspect ratio** to 'Landscape 4:3'.
 - b. Change Lighting to Dramatic Light.
 - c. Change **Camera Angle** to **Landscape photography**.

5. Click the **Generate** button to lock in the updated settings and review the new set of variants.

Continuing within the same screen:

- 6. Navigate to the **Styles** section within the left column.
- 7. Within the **Reference** section, upload the style reference to be applied.
 - a. Adobe Stock alpine mountain photo (licensed)
 - b. Watermarked version available

Once the style reference has uploaded:

- 8. Adjust the **Strength** slider to the level you prefer. (Adjusts the strength of style matching and effects with a single control.)
- 9. With the **Style Reference** uploaded, click to **Generate** button to apply the style updates.
- 10. For an additional visual enhancement on the output, adjust the **Visual intensity** slider. (*Adjusts the overall intensity of your photo's existing visual characteristics*)







When satisfied with the overall style of the output variations:

- 11. Click the **Save as a style kit** button within the right-side of the **Text to image** header.
- 12. Name your style kit: Golden Landscape.
- Update settings and check the following boxes to allow changes to the **Prompt**, **General**, and **Composition**, and click **Save**.
 - a. Unchecked items will be turned off or hidden from editing when the style kit is shared.

Note: To create and save Style Kits in Adobe Firefly, you must be entitled to Creative Cloud for enterprise Pro Firefly (Creative Cloud for enterprise – Edition 4) or/and Creative Cloud Pro Plus (Creative Cloud for enterprise – Edition 4 w/ Premium Stock) plans. If you aren't, you can access and use Style Kits shared with you only using the collaboration invitation links.





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14. In the Share style kit dialog box, enter the recipient's name, add multiple email addresses to share the kit with, or update in the dropdown who has access to the newly created style kit.









Accessing the newly created the style kit

- 15. Go to the **Files** tab within the Firefly website, and select **Style kits**.
- 16. Click on the Golden Landscape style kit.





Using the newly created style kit

- 17. Test the newly created style kit with a few new prompts.
 - a. A kayaker paddling down a river with rapids
 - b. A person meditating on a lakeshore with a beautiful serene view
 - c. A rock climber hanging off a cliff
- 18. Click the **Generate** button to see your updates and style kit in action.
- 19. If you need to adjust the image to support a resolution, update the Aspect Ratio accordingly.







Exercise 2

Leverage Creative Cloud Libraries to help manage and share generated assets

1. Continuing with the current set of Firefly outputs, hover over a variant that you'd like to save and share for future use, click on the **Share** icon and select **Save to library**.





- 2. Within your library list window, click the icon in the upper right to **Add library**.
- 3. Create a new library.
 - a. Name: FF Workshop #3
 - b. Save to: Personal Storage
- 4. Click **Create** to establish the new library.

5. Your newly created library will be selected by default, and for this exercise, select the **Set as default library** checkbox, then click **Save**.

6. Update the prompt field, generate a few additional images, and add your favorites to the new library.

- b. A person meditating on a lakeshore with a beautiful serene view
- c. A rock climber hanging off a cliff

Exercise 3

Utilize locking and additional template-driven features

1. Open Express.

https://new.express.adobe.com/





- 2. Click on the + icon in the upper left, and create a 9:16 project.
- 3. Rename your new file within the header.





4. Access your newly created library.

5. Drag and drop one of the Firefly generated assets onto your Express page, scale the image up, and position it to allow for copy on the left side.





6. Once the image has been positioned, click the button to **Set as page background**.

7. With the image as the background, click the **Reframe** button and move background image into your desired position.







 Once the image has been set and reframed as the background, right click on the image and select Lock: allow image replace to start building out your template.





 Now let's add some text. Click on the Text icon in the left menu and click the button Add your text.

10. With the text field on your page, modify the type properties and position.





11. Right click on the text box and select **Lock: allow text replace**.





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12. Let's add a rectangle to create a footer. Click on the **Elements** menu and select a solid rectangle.





13. With the rectangle on your page, drag it to the bottom and stretch it out across the entire bottom of the page.





14. Now let's add some text to the footer. Click on the **Text** icon in the left menu and click the button **Add your text**.

15. With the new text field on your page, modify the type properties and position.





16. Right click on the text box and select **Lock: allow text replace**.





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Sharing and accessing the newly created template

17. With the layout of your design done, click the **Share** button in the upper right corner, and select **Make a template**.





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- 18. Confirm the library that you're saving your template in and include an optional note explaining the details of the shared template.
- 19. Click on the Locks & Restrictions button.





20. Set restrictions to what can and cannot be done within the template.





21. Click the **Save template** button.





Your new template is saved in the library that you're working from with all of your other assets and can be accessed by navigating to Your Stuff / Libraries / FF Workshop #3

Note: To share the template, you'd share the entire library that the template is saved in.





Bonus Exercise

Accelerate the creation of bulk ad variations with Adobe Express

- 1. Let's access the newly created template within your library.
 - a. Your Stuff / Libraries / FF Workshop #3



2. Double-click on the template file, and **Start a new file**.

3. Click on the **Resize** button within the top menu.

- 4. Select a few different options to quickly resize your project, and click
 Duplicate & resize
 - a. Flyer
 - b. Web Banner

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5. With the newly sized pages created, let's move a few things around to support the different-sized layouts. Double-click into the middle **Web Banner** page.

 Select the background image, and in the edit panel, click the Replace Background button and select Libraries.

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7. Select a new image from your Library and click the **Replace** button.

8. Click/select the rectangle at the bottom of the page, click on the shape handle on the right, hold down your Option key and scale the rectangle to fill the entire width of the page.

9. Now click on a text box and replace the text while preserving the placement and style.

- 10. Once all the edits are done within your pages:
 - a. You can share for review and feedback by clicking on the **Share** button in the upper right header.
 - b. You can download all the page files by clicking on the **Download** button in the upper right header.
